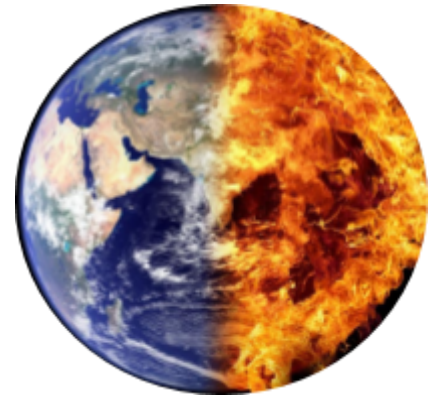

## World Environment Day 2019 - Home Learning Project



Dear Parents and Children,

The environment especially pollution from plastics is in the news on a regular basis. It is really important that we all understand the seriousness of this issue and the role that we can play in making our environment cleaner and safer for everyone. Islam also teaches us about our responsibility towards looking after the environment.

We will be marking World Environment Day - a day to raise awareness of the environment - in a special assembly on 4th March 2019. The theme for this year will be 'Pollution'. Each class will focus on one type of pollution - please see below. The children will take part in various activities in the week before the assembly.

We would like you and your children to work together on creating a World Environment Home Learning Project. The children will be given 2 weeks to complete their projects and then hand in to their class teachers. The home learning projects will be presented in class and then used to produce whole class work to be presented in the assembly.

### Class Projects:

- EYFS - link to Understanding the World.
- Years 1 & 2 - Noise pollution
- Years 3 & 4 - Water pollution
- Year 5 - Air pollution
- Year 6 - Soil pollution

### Types of projects:

- ★ Posters
- ★ Dioramas/3D models
- ★ Hanging mobile displays
- ★ Powerpoint slide shows
- ★ Craft activities
- ★ Poems
- ★ Fact files
- ★ Reports
- ★ Any other ideas?

### Information to include:

- ★ What kind of pollution is it? Describe it.
- ★ Where is it found?
- ★ Who produces this kind of pollution?
- ★ How is it produced?
- ★ What are the effects of it on the environment?
- ★ What can we do to reduce its harmful effects?

### Tips for making good home learning projects

- ★ Clearly label your project with your name and year group.
- ★ Paper size for posters – Minimum A4, Maximum A3.
- ★ You can type or handwrite the text but no spelling mistakes.
- ★ Make it eye catching – you want people to stop and look at your work, you can draw, paint, colour in or make a collage.
- ★ Posters must be simple, accurate, readable, well spaced and colourful.
- ★ Your parents or siblings can help you make the project or check your work for you before you submit it.
