


## Year 1 Assembly

## School Lunches

Dear parents please clear all outstanding debts for lunches today. We ask that in future that your child be in credit for lunch in advance. The cost of school lunch is £2.10 per child, per day. If your child has lunch everyday, the cost will be £10.50 per week.

If your child has a packed lunch, please ensure that it is a balanced meal, containing some fruit.



## Parking

## Reception Admissions

If your child was born between **01/09/15 and 31/08/16** then apply online to the borough you reside in for Reception Class to start in September 2020. The deadline is **Wednesday 15th of January 2020**.

You also need to submit a completed Iqra Supplementary form with the receipt of your online application, proof of address and original birth certificate.

You must clearly indicate on both forms if you will have children studying in Iqra School next September.

Full details of medical, behaviour and developmental needs should be noted on the supplementary form.



## Secondary School Transfers

Parents who have children currently studying in Year 6 and have not as yet applied for a secondary school must contact the borough they reside in immediately.



## Forest School

We at Iqra Primary School have been offering the Forest School provision to early years for the past three years in our small but functional garden. We are very pleased that as of this week we have launched the 'Forest School curriculum' from Nursery to Year 6 at Clapham common woodland for Year 1-Year 6 classes.

The Curriculum will offer all children the chance to gain valuable learning opportunities in the outdoor environment. As you are aware outdoor education plays a huge part in children's lives as it empowers them and they learn more about their natural environment.

Forest schools use natural habitats to develop independence skills and improve self-esteem.. It provides children with the freedom to explore and experience the woodland. The pupils will learn a wealth of skills that can be applied to every day life.
